You've all previously had a flier advertising this event. And see the current Listings. Tony Harland has taken the lead on organising the event and writes as follows:

Most of you will know that for many years the RSCDS has held its "Festival" in June at various outdoor locations, but the weather hasn't been too kind to us of late, so we thought we'd give September a chance. We've also decided to have a go at moving more to the west, hence the Swansea area.

Now this isn't the same as the Festival event: it's simple Scottish dancing (all dances walked through) plus Ceilidh dances. The reason for this is that we want the public to get involved, with the intention that if some people really enjoy themselves we can tempt them into giving Scottish dancing a go. It's still bring a picnic time and if you have any friends you think would enjoy some simple dances then please bring them as well.

In case of wet weather we have a backup venue, the Ostreme Centre, right by the castle, on the corner of Newton Road and Castle Avenue, with a good dance floor.

We don't expect you to dance for the whole two-and-a-half hours, soooooo, about half way through. while we have our picnics, Sweyns Ey are going to give us a dazzling display of Morris dancing.

SCD TECHNIQUE WORKSHOP, ST PAUL'S PARISH CENTRE, DE LA BECHE ROAD, SKETTY, SA2 9AR SUNDAY 27 OCTOBER, 2:30 – 5:00 PM

This workshop has been organised in response to a wish expressed by some members at our AGM in June. They wanted a chance for us all to improve our **dancing** (i.e.not just to learn **dances**).

We have been delighted that Alison Littlejohn, a very experienced teacher whose forte is technique and who is herself a beautiful dancer, has been willing to take this on. It may be that this workshop will be the precursor of regular technique classes. Alison has set out her ideas about how she will organise the October workshop:

The aim of this workshop is for dancers to build confidence in their knowledge of formations used in Scottish Country Dancing through phrasing, covering and teamwork. There will be the opportunity for improvement in technique of the steps and transitions between the steps required in the formations taught.

Some of the formations to be covered will be selected from the following, Four hands across and back Hands round and back Reels of three Double triangles Bourrel Poussette Grand chain Ladies' and men's chains

EXCITING NEWS FROM ALEX GRAY, OUR VICE-PRESIDENT

In August Alex sent us the following: Some time ago I entered a couple of dances for consideration for the Edinburgh "One Hundred Years" Book. I gather that well over fifty submissions were received. I've just heard that the two dances with music by James which I submitted are among the fourteen that have been chosen for publication. They're called **Joppa Rocks** and **Jock's Lodge**.

James composed three tunes for **Joppa Rocks** – "Joppa Rocks", "Porty Prom", and "Coal & Salt", and for the other dance he composed "The Professor . The tunes for **Joppa Rocks** are concerned with the rocks at the eastern end of Portobello promenade, where the coal seams come to the surface, along with seams of other rock types. The coal was used in the Joppa salt pans to heat the sea water in a big enclosure to evaporate the water and make sea salt crystals. The other dance is a strathspey. James wrote the tune when Cardiff University made me a professor.



Alex also sent us pictures (see above for one of those pictures) of the continuing beauty of the roses given to him by the Branch to (in his words) "remind me of the happy times Kate and I had dancing for forty-seven years in South Wales. Thank you once again."
